

Competition Classes, Judging & Scoring

Determining ACC Competition Classes

At the beginning of every ACC season, the competition team will determine what Competition Class each member is qualified to be entered into. These classes can change from season to season according to the final average of scores from the previous season. Members can go up or down in classes.

Below are the average scores in each class:

Class B – an average score of 19 or below

Class A – an average of 20-21

Class AA – an average of 22

Class AAA – an average of 23 and above

All new members will be placed in Class B for the first year.

Judging Prints & Images

Three qualified judges are selected from neighboring CACCA clubs to judge both Prints and Digital Projected Images entered in each ACC Competition. Both prints and images are judged according to CACCA rules. Each judge can score a print up to 9 points. A print can receive up to a total of 27 points (perfect score).
